**MINUTES OF THE CO-DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE (CDDC)
MEETING, RANGIA, FOR THE MONTH OF JULY 2025**

Venue: Conference Hall, Co-District Commissioner's Office, Rangia

The meeting was presided over by Shri Debashis Goswami, ACS, Co-District Commissioner of Rangia. At the very beginning, he welcomed all the members present. Before initiating the discussion, the CDC stated that it had come to his notice, through regular visits by the Assistant Commissioners of Rangia to various offices, that the attendance of officers and staff of the line departments was not satisfactory. He advised all officers and staff to maintain regular attendance, failing which strict action would be taken against the concerned officer or staff member.

The meeting started with departmental PowerPoint presentations, and subsequently, the following decisions were taken.

Handlooms & Textiles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The Superintendent of Handlooms & Textiles, Rangia informed that regular drives have been conducted against power loom-made gamusas in Rangia. ● The CDC questioned the Superintendent of Handlooms & Textiles about what other initiatives, apart from the regular drives, have been taken by the department to make weavers self-reliant. The Superintendent informed that no such initiatives are currently in place. ● The CDC then asked the Superintendent to explore such initiatives in the spirit of making women weavers self-reliant. Health & Family Welfare	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Sub-Divisional Medical & Health Officer (SDM&HO), Rangia briefed about the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme. She informed that two Panchayats—Jayantipur and Ischadagharia—in Rangia are now TB mukt. • She further informed that out of 234 notified TB cases in 2023–24 in Rangia, 230 cases have been cured, achieving a cure rate of over 90%. • She also informed that out of 305 live births in Rangia during the period from April to May, zero maternal deaths have been reported. • The CDC directed the Assistant Commissioner and the SDM&HO to physically inspect the progress of the Rangia BPHC, which is being constructed by the National Health Mission, Assam. Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The BEEO-cum-BMC, Rangia submitted a detailed report on the P.B. Kaniha High School to mark its centenary. • The BEEO informed that the mid-day meal is being served to all students of the elementary schools. • The CDC asked the BEEO to furnish the details of the elementary schools where mid-day meal is served, along with the coordinates, CRC, Headmasters' details, to the CDC at the earliest. • On being apprised of the lack of teaching staff in many schools, the CDC directed the BO, Development, to prepare a letter to the DC, with a copy to the Inspector of Schools, regarding the issue. The BEEO added that there are 17 schools in Rangia Education Block with only one teaching staff member. The CDC asked him to share the list of those schools. • The CDC also instructed the BO, Development, to write a letter to the Inspector of Schools, requesting him to submit the list of schools that fall under the newly delimited Rangia LAC. Fisheries	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The representative of the Sub-Divisional Fishery Officer (SDFO), Rangia, informed that 2,523 registrations on the National Fisheries Digital Platform (NFDP) under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Kisan Samridhi Sah-Yojana have been completed in Rangia. • She also informed that awareness camps are being conducted to raise public awareness about NFDP registrations. The CDC assured all possible assistance from his side. She also informed that the DC, Kamrup, has flagged off Crop Insurance Week (July 1 to July 7) under the PMFBY from the DC Office. The representative of SDAO further informed that sowing of paddy seeds has been carried out in various villages under the Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) in Rangia. PWD (Building)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The CDC informed that he would raise current status regarding the handing over of the newly built Law College in Rangia at the upcoming District Development Committee meeting. • He also asked the AEE to prepare a current status report on the Siddhinath PHC, which was demolished, so that it can be taken up with the Health Department. • The AEE informed the meeting that the physical progress of the Integrated Co-District Commissioner's Office in Rangia is at 98% and the Town Hall in Rangia is at 99%, while the physical progress of the Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Avasiya Vidyalaya in Rangia is at 1%. • The CDC asked the AEE to make preparations for the foundation stone laying ceremony of the Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Avasiya Vidyalaya, which is to be conducted by the Hon'ble MLA of Rangia. Sericulture	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Superintendent of Sericulture, Rangia informed that 1,124 families in Rangia are currently engaged in the eri, mulberry and muga sectors. • The CDC asked the Superintendent to take up the issues arising from IBS Convergence under the MGNREGA Scheme with the respective BDOs. Smt. Jiljily Thaosen, ACS, Assistant Commissioner of Rangia is directed to assist her in taking up the issue with the BDO of Bihdia Jajikona. 	Superintendent of Sericulture, Rangia
Public Health Engineering	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The EE (i/c), PHED Rangia informed that the coverage of households with Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTC) in Rangia has reached 88.12%. Only 10,742 households remain to be covered. • She also informed that 10 new Piped Water Supply Schemes (PWSS) have been announced for Rangia in the financial year 2025-26. • The CDC asked the EE to immediately take up the land-related issues concerning the Murara No. 1 PWSS with the Circle Officer, Rangia, as it is a major project expected to benefit more than 200 households. • The CDC further instructed the EE to carry out periodic inspections of the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) schemes and to take feedback from the beneficiaries. He also directed the Assistant Commissioners to interact with the beneficiaries of the JJM schemes and collect their feedback. 	EE (i/c), PHED, Rangia
