Subject	Minutes of the Meeting of District Development Committee of Kamrup District
Date & Time	11 th of June, 2025 at 11:00 AM
Venue	Conference Hall, O/o the District Commissioner, Kamrup

The meeting was chaired by Sri Susanta Kumar Dutta, ACS, DDC, Kamrup. The meeting started with welcome address from the Chairperson and following discussions on Inter-Departmental issues are also took place :

1. EE, PWD (R), Hajo-Sualkuchi TRD apprised the house that there is a leakage of water from a pipe installed by PHE Department at approach road to Dalibari Primary Health Centre which is causing significant damage to the road and hampering the works. Official from PHED apprised that the mentioned work under PHED were done way before the road was constructed and hence no specification of channeling the water was included in the estimate. Chairperson instructed EE, PHED of concerned division to find a feasible solution to resolve the issue.
2. EE, PWD (R), South Kamrup TRD apprised about a hindrance in construction of E&D Bund under Asom Mala 2.0. The Officer informed about non-cooperation by the owner for land filling in approximately 200 meter portion at Ambari. DDC, Kamrup asked the concerned EE to write to ADC (Rev) or ADC (LA) for taking necessary action.
3. In response to the request of EE, PWD (R), South Kamrup TRD regarding future functionality and maintenance of streetlights to be installed under Nagariya Paki Path Asoni, the Chairperson instructed that decision regarding future user agency to be taken up on a later stage.
4. EE, PHED, Rangia Division apprised the house that approval for the use of land in Manikpur LP School under Karara education Block (which is now abandoned) is yet to receive. This has delayed in implementation of a clean water facility scheme in that area. DEEO, Kamrup assured to take up the matter with concerned BEEO.
5. EE, PHED also apprised that confirmation of finalization of land is yet to be received from Circle Officers for forwarding new scheme proposals to the Government. Also, submission of estimates by APDCL for the electrical connection part of the schemes is still pending. Chairperson asked officials from APDCL to expedite the matter and resolve the issues accordingly in consultation with PHED. Chairperson also asked EE, PHED to write to ADC (Revenue) regarding the issue.

After the discussion , departments were reviewed with focus on Central and State Level Flagship Schemes. The key discussions/decisions are as follows :
